For the next few Friday's we will be having FUN FRIDAY'S. Students will be able to bring items to school for LUNCHTIME play.



CAKES

Ingredients:

- 300g kumara - boiled and mashed
- 200g canned salmon or tuna
- 2 spring onions - finely chopped
- 2 tbsp parsley - chopped
- pinch of salt and pepper to taste
- squeeze of lemon to taste
- ¼ cup flour
- 1 tbsp vegetable oil

Combine all ingredients except flour in a bowl. Place flour onto a plate. Form the mixture into small patties and lightly roll through the flour. Heat oil in a frying pan and cook the patties until golden brown on both sides. Makes 12 fish cakes. Enjoy as a snack or add a salad and have for lunch or dinner.
